

One of the war poems by Ian Martin, a member of our congregation, which was read out in church during the WW1 Event yesterday:

AND THE POPPIES SWAY

Because we knew our boys would do us proud

Yet over a million of our boys gave their lives

As they let me feel, I am still keep in touch.

So as these blood red poppies, stand tall and sway
They have become a symbol of that grateful day

As it makes us feel they are still by our side.
